proposed music venue (Rob Sylvain)	BNA was mentioned in the packet to Planning Board, and it said that the developers went to BNA, and people were "excited." There has been some pressure for BNA make a statement about the new proposed 3,300-seat Portland Music Hall by Live Nation and Mile Marker Investments at the corner of Cumberland Ave and Myrtle St. Rob asked Amelia Labreck, chair of Developments Team, to write something that reflects different viewpoints while reinforcing BNA's core principles.	Rob will revise letter and send to Todd Goldenfarb and post it on BNA website.

	Amelia's letter says that Bayside residents and business owners are concerned about traffic congestion and dwindling street parking.

	Jim said there will be another Planning Board workshop on the project, and then it will be up for a vote.	
217-unit building proposed (Amelia Labreck)	Port Property wants to demolish the brick building (includes mental health crisis space at 62 Elm St and Health Care for the Homeless, 63 Preble St) behind the parking garage and build 10-story building with 217 residential units and ground-level retail. Neighborhood meeting is now. A lot of people were not aware of the meeting.	
Teams Report (Rob Sylvain)	Board approved March Teams Report.	
update (Henry Myer)	A person who was in Elena's Way moved into housing about a week ago. The area has been sometimes very busy and sometimes not. Housing vouchers are not available. Hope House has \$1 million deficit and Elena's Way has \$1.4 million deficit. Funding cuts seem to be coming. Preble Street and other agencies do depend a lot on federal funding.	
Community Policing update (Dan Knight)	Things seem to be picking up a little bit. Police try to move people along. Community Policing Office is expanding its space!	
	We didn't have a policy so we cobbled one together, mostly from what has been in Bylaws. We just want it to comply with requirement. It's a work in progress.

Amendments to We would like to amend Bylaws. One main change $\overline{}$ Colette will reserve Bylaws (Jim Hall) is revised election process (individual candidates an ad that announces must receive a majority of "yes" votes from valid Annual Meeting and gives ballots cast, and are elected to open seats from link to amended Bylaws most to least votes until seats are filled). Other main document changes are to have Board elect President and Organization seats, insert new mission statement, and shift some detailed requirements and processes Final vote on from bylaws into a policy document (board amended Bylaws at May residency requirements, board size, schedule for 6th Board Meeting alternating board slates, handling of ties, etc.). Alex said he thinks that 2/3 residents on Board is a high bar. He suggested that one-half plus one is more realistic. Sarah said 2/3 residents requirement is needed because residents' point of view has been ignored too much in Bayside. Other Board members expressed that 2/3 ratio is fine for now. We need to publish the wording of amendments and announce Annual Meeting. Board voted in favor of Bylaws Amendments. Nominating and Jim said printouts distributed at tonight's meeting $\overline{\mathsf{A}}$ Jim or Rob will Election are not the latest version. Jim or Rob will re-send re-send "Nominating and Procedures document. Rob suggested that we move forward as Election Procedures" with changes (Jim Hall) though these changes will go forward. The changes final proposed changes. won't go into effect until amended Bylaws are voted on. Vote on Nominating Board voted to have 5 open Board seats for the next and Election Procedures annual election. at May 6th board meeting Board voted to permit Nominating Committee to try to fill all seats. BNA is seeking people who are interested in being a Board member. Tom Blackburn, a former Board member, said he reluctantly agreed to be considered for Board seat. Amelia Labreck is happy with her current role in BNA, chair of Developments Team.
